HIGH SCHOOL CAFETERIAS GET A LOCAL FOOD MAKEOVER

Fresh, Healthy, Local Food Coming to Durham Schools Thanks to Ecosource Partnership

An innovative project facilitated by Ecosource means fresh, healthy meals made from local food will be on the plates of high school students in the Durham Region.

With support from the Greenbelt Fund, and funding from the Ontario government, Ecosource will develop a series of educational programs and events to increase student and cafeteria staff engagement in buy local programs and drive local food sales in public high schools.

"Ecosource will build on their past success in Peel Region schools with this latest project. With three children of my own, I can relate to the need for educating kids on local food early on. We are eager to see more school boards, including the Durham District School Board, get involved in local food education and increased purchasing of local food. The result—more local food for Ontarians and happier, healthier students," says Burkhard Mausberg, CEO of the Greenbelt Fund.

Ecosource will partner with Compass Group Canada and the Durham District School Board for the *Cafeteria Connects: Bringing Ontario Foods to Secondary School Cafeterias* (\$109,000) project. This partnership will create training for cafeteria staff on how to purchase, track, prepare, and communicate about local food options. Ecosource will also host events celebrating the produce and farmers of Ontario and the Durham Region. These efforts will be supported by educational opportunities for students with Ecosource developing and delivering workshops that integrate local food education into several curricula including business, hospitality, and family studies.

"Ecosource is pleased to build on past successes and partnerships in Peel Region as we work together to change the face of food in Durham District School Board cafeterias and engage students in food literacy in Durham classrooms," says Stephanie Crocker, Executive Director at Ecosource.

"It's great to see everyone working together to put more Ontario food on dinner plates in our daycares, schools, and healthcare facilities in Ajax and Pickering. We support and encourage these types of projects because we know how good they are for our farmers, our health, and our local economies," says Joe Dickson, MPP for Ajax-Pickering.

Since its launch in 2010, the Greenbelt Fund has supported 78 projects with funding totalling \$7.4 million, increasing the amount of local food available across the province. The province's total investments toward broader sector programming means a targeted return of \$38.9 million
